




About IPOR

Survey Methodology

Period: April 28- May 07, 2021

Eligibility: Agile 18+.

Response Rate: Approximately 41%

Margin of Error: Not More than $\pm 3.03\%$ at 95% confidence level at national-level results.

Sample size = 1,046

• Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the survey was conducted through Computer Assisted Telephonic Interviews (CATI). These interviews were conducted by a team of trained professionals with an attempt to closely match the demographic spread of Pakistan.

- A phone panel comprised of randomly selected 219,872 active mobile phone users was used as sampling frame to draw sample of adult residents in all four provinces. This Phone Panel was made through Face-to-Face data collection across all districts of Pakistan.
- In the first stage, allocation of primary sample units (PSU) was made by distributing sample to all the provinces as per their actual share. In the second stage, phone number were sorted in 65 districts, and then selection was be made using systematic Sampling with a Random Start (SSRS).

• The information in this report has been compiled in accordance with international standards for market and social research methodologies. Figures in charts and tables may not sum to 100 percent due to rounding error.

Survey Method: Computer Assisted Telephonic Interviews (CATI)








EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

CORONA SITUATION


- 69% of the respondents reported that the current coronavirus situation in Pakistan is getting worse.
- 59% of the respondents are willing to take the vaccine, but 37% are still reluctant and said they will not take any vaccine.
- 50% of the respondents preferred Chinese vaccine over the vaccine from other countries.
- 31% of the respondents said someone in their social circle have been vaccinated.
- 53% of the respondents reported they don't trust on the information regarding coronavirus circulating on social media.

PERFORMANCE OF GOVERNMENT

- More people are dissatisfied with PM than ever before. There is a decrease of massive 16% in approval rating of PM from 56% to 42% regarding the handling of coronavirus situation in the country.
- Loosing the confidence of people a majority 65% of the people now rating either bad or very bad performance by the PM Imran Khan at more than half the time of his tenure.




COVID-19 Perception in Wave-III




CURRENT CORONA SITUATION IN PAKISTAN

Q: What's your opinion about the coronavirus situation in Pakistan, do you think is it getting very worse, about the same or getting better?






Majority 69% of the respondents reported that the current coronavirus situation in Pakistan is getting worse.



WILLINGTO TAKEA SHOT OF VACCINE


Q: As you know the vaccination for Coronavirus is now available in Pakistan, are you willing to take a shot of the vaccine for you and your family?

59% of the respondents said they are willing to take the vaccine for themselves & their families, but 37% are still reluctant and said they will not take any vaccine.






PREFERRED VACCINE









PREFERRED VACCINE

[Only 37% those are not willing to take a shot of Vaccines]




33% of the respondents reported they don't want to take a shot of the vaccine because "It's not needed for us".




ANY ONE IN YOUR SOCIAL CIRCAL

Q: Do you know any one in your social circle such as relative, friends, co-workerswho have been vaccinated?






31% of the respondents said someone in their social circle have been vaccinated.





LEVEL OF TRUST




53% of the respondents reported they don't trust on the information regarding coronavirus circulating on social media.


PRIVATE COMPANIES

Q:The government has also allowed private companies to vaccinate and has set the price from Rs.8000-12000. Do you think, is it a fair price, it should cost less or should be free?






Majority 54% of the Pakistanis said that the Coronavirus vaccine provided by the private companies should be free.




SATISFIED OR DISSATISFIED





IPOR asked a similar question in June & December 2020 during Wave-I & wave-II of the pandemic, comparing these results in wake of 3rd Wave, there is a decrease of massive 16% in approval rating of PM from 56% to 42% regarding the handling of coronavirus situation in the country.





Q: What do you think, which political leader can solve the challenges faced by Pakistan? (For example: Corona Virus, inflation, unemployment, weak economy etc.)




