
# TV Viewing Habits in Pakistan During COVID-19



#### **Executive Summary**

Women are watching more TV than men since the lockdown Turkish dramas are more popular in Pakistan then the Pakistani dramas

This is IPOR second survey on its COVID-19 survey's series. In this series, IPOR put the question to general public to know what their TV viewing habits are during the COVID-19. IPOR took a national representative panel of 1205 respondents for this survey. Some of the key findings of this survey are as follow;

39% of the Pakistanis reported watching less TV since the lockdown. While 31% of the respondents said they have started watching more, while no change was observed in 18% of total respondents. The gender wise breakdown of the data shows that the women are watching more TV than men since the lockdown.

Majority 48% of the respondents said they watch news frequently, followed by Drama/Movies 34% and another 27% reported Talk Shows.

60% of men prefer watching news channels as compare to women 31%.

51% women are watching Dramas and movies as compare to men 23%.

Province wise breakdown shows that in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) majority 55% of the respondents spend less time watching TV, whereas in Baluchistan majority 45% reported that there is no change in their TV watching habits. On the other hand, 32% and 48% people are watching less TV in Punjab and Sindh respectively.

59% of people in Baluchistan watch news most frequently whereas 41% of Punjab respondents Watch Dramas/Movies. Turkish dramas are more popular in Pakistan then the Pakistani dramas as the he popularity of "Ertugrul Ghazi" is evident as 27% of the respondents reported they are watching Ertugrul Ghazi these days.



Majority 47% of the respondents support Turkish dramas, followed by 9% opposed the telecast of Turkish Dramas and another 15% neither support nor oppose this.

The provincial wise breakdown shows that the Turkish dramas are more popular in Punjab 55% and KP 53%, while they are less popular in Sindh 44% and Baluchistan 43%.

#### Survey Methodology

Jun 08-12, 2020 Period:

Eligibility: Age 18+.

Response Rate: Approximately 59%








Since the lockdown is imposed due to COVID-19, have you started watching television more, less or same as before?

39% of the Pakistanis reported watching less TV since the lockdown. While 31% of the Pakistanis have started watching more and no change was observed in \$18% of total respondents.






The graph represents inclination of women towards watching TV as compare to men since the lockdown.






60% of men prefer watching news channels as compare to women 31%.


By Province

The popularity of Ertugul is evident as 27% of the respondents reported they are watching Ertugral Ghazi these days.




These days Urdu dubbed Turkish dramas are being telecast, do you support, oppose or neither support nor oppose this?






Majority 47% of the respondents support Turkish dramas, followed by 9% opposed the telecast of Turkish Dramas and another 15% neither support nor oppose this.



# These days Urdu dubbed Turkish dramas are being telecast, do you? (Slide 2/2)






Support for the Turkish drama is more in Punjab 55% and KP 53%. While Turkish Dramas are less popular in Sindh 44% and Balochistan 43%.
