

Survey Methodology

May 11-15, 2020 Period:

Eligibility: Age 18+.

Response Rate: Approximately 57%


Margin of Error: ±2.34% at 95% for national result.

Sample size = 1753

• IPOR has a respondents panel for data collection.

- The survey was conducted through Computer Assisted Telephonic Interviews (CATI), from randomly selected panel of respondents based upon proportion to population sample of adult residents in all four provinces of Pakistan.
- The information in this report has been compiled in accordance with international standards for market and social research methodologies.
- Figures in charts and tables may not sum to 100 percent due to rounding error.



Executive Summary

This is IPOR first survey on its COVID-19 survey's series. IPOR has come up with the most heat generated question on media, what government should do regarding lockdown? Opinions are mostly divided among intellectuals so IPOR put the question to general public and take the response of our national collective consciousness. IPOR took a national representative panel of 1753 respondents for this survey. Some of the key findings of the survey are as follow;

- Only 8% of the respondent considered the lockdown as fully (100%) successful while majority of the respondent said the lockdown was partially (half or quarter) successful in achieving the objectives.
- 58% respondents want that government should end the lockdown or at least do a smart lockdown. While 27% said government should extend the lockdown.
- 44% of the respondent said their household expenses are increased during the lock down, 22% said it remained the same while 23% said they have brought decrease in their household expenditures.
- 68% of the respondent said their personal economic situation got worse due to lockdown, 20% said it remained the same.
- Respondent who want government should end the lockdown are those 85% people whose economic situation got worse during the lockdown.
 - Majority of the respondents whose income level is PKR 25000 or less want (38%) to either immediately end the lockdown or at least impose a smart lockdown (25%).




In your opinion, at what percentage the lockdown imposed by the government is successful in achieving its objectives?



In your opinion, at what percentage the lockdown imposed by the government is successful in achieving its objectives?








In Balochistan majority 16% of the respondents agreed that lockdown was 100% (fully) successful, whereas in Punjab majority 36% said it was not successful and only 6% believed it was fully successful. That shows the people believed that effectiveness of lockdown was much better in Balochistan than in other provinces.








Most frustration is seen in seen in the Sindh respondents where 37% of people want immediately to end of lockdown whereas 40% of KP respondents want smart lockdown

"Of the respondents their household income level is level between [less than 25000] per month






Majority of the respondents whose income level is 25000 or less want (38%)to either immediately end the lockdown or at least impose a smart lockdown (25%).


44% of the respondents reported there is a Increase in daily expenses due to the lockdown situation.

"Of the people who are [31%] informed lockdown should end"




Off those people 31% who said the lockdown should end immediately, the data shows they are the one whose expenses have gone up 48 % during the lockdown.

In the past 7 weeks of the lockdown how was your personal economic situation got worse, improved or remained the same?




85% of the majority (31%) favoring ending lockdown immediately where the one most economically effected stratum in Pakistan
