Executive Summary

The **Institute for Public Opinion Research (IPOR)** conducted a quantitative survey to gauge public opinion on political protests, lockdowns, and their socio-economic impacts from the residents of Islamabad and Rawalpindi. The survey interviewed a representative sample of adults (aged 18 and above) across the twin cities.

Key Findings:

- **Support for Peaceful Protests**: A significant majority (73%) of Islamabad/Rawalpindi residents support peaceful protests by political parties, while 24% do not endorse such demonstrations at all.
- **Impact on Daily Life**: An overwhelming 82% residents of Islamabad/Rawalpindi believe the lockdown resulting from PTI protests disrupted daily life, with only 17% stating otherwise.
- Economic Impact: About 74% reported that protests and lockdowns negatively affected their business or income, whereas 24% saw no such impact.
- **Government Response**: Opinions on government measures during the lockdown are divided—42% find them justified, but 48% perceive them as an overreaction.
- **Responsibility for Economic Crisis**: A plurality of respondents (53%) hold the government and coalition parties accountable for the economic impact of the political crisis, while 18% blame PTI and opposition parties
- **Instability and Protests**: Two-thirds (66%) of respondents identify political protests and rallies as the primary cause of instability, while 26% disagree.
- Support for PTI Protests: A notable 68% residents of Islamabad/Rawalpindi will not support PTI's protest, whereas 24% express their support even if caused some inconvenience.



These findings highlight widespread concerns about the disruptions and instability caused by political protests and lockdowns, reflecting a divided public stance on their necessity and justification.

METHODOLOGY

APPROACH

Computer Assisted Telephonic (CATI) Interviews

SAMPLE

N=1044 (Residents of Islamabad/Rawalpindi ONLY)

Age=18+

A phone panel comprised of randomly selected 310,668 active mobile phone users was used as sampling frame to draw the sample of adult residents of RWP/ISD. This Phone Panel was made through Face-to-Face data collection. The selection of respondents were made using Systematic Sampling with a Random Start (SSRS).



Question 1: Do you support peaceful protest of any political party?







Insight: 73% people supports peaceful protest of any political party, while 24% people does not support.



Question 2: Has the lockdown resulting from PTI protests in Rawalpindi/Islamabad caused any disruption to the daily life of the general public?








ilnsight:82% of resident of <u>Islamabad/Rawalpindi</u> believed that the lockdown resulting from PTI protests disrupted the daily lives of the general public, while 17% believe t did not cause any disruption.




Question 3: Do you think the protests and lockdown have had an impact on your income or business?

Question 4: Do you think that the steps taken by the government after the PTI protest and the announcement of lockdown are justified or is the government overreacting?






Insight: 74% of Islamabad/RWP residents believe protests and lockdowns impact their daily business or income, while 24% perceive no such impact. Regarding the government's measures on lockdowns, 42% consider them justified, whereas 48% believe the government overreacted.



Question 5: In your opinion, who is responsible for the economic impact of the political crisis in the country?






Insight:18% of respondents from Islamabad/Rawalpindi attribute the economic impact of the political crisis in the country to PTI and opposition parties, while 53% hold the government and coalition parties responsible.



Question: 6 Do you think that political protests/rallies are the main cause of Political instability in the country?








Insight: A majority of respondents (66%) believed that political protests and rallies are the primary cause of instability in the country, while 26% disagree with this view.

Question 7: Would you support PTI's protest, even if it causes temporary inconvenience to the people of Pakistan?










Insight: A significant majority, 68% of respondents of Islamabad/Rawalpindi, indicated that they WILL NOT support PTI's protest, even if it results in temporary inconvenience for the people of Pakistan. In contrast, 24% expressed their support for the protest.

Survey Demographic

The IPOR survey respondents consisted of 63% males and 37% females. In terms of age distribution, 20% were between 18 and 24 years old, 31% were between 25 and 34 years old, 29% were between 35 and 49 year old and 20% were above 50 years old. 11% are illiterate, 10% have completed primary education, 16% have completed secondary education, 28% have completed matriculation, 17% have completed intermediate education, 15% are graduates, and 3% have completed a master's degree.
