Sampling Methodology





Period :	29 th November- 22 nd December 2025
Survey Type :	In-person, in-home Face-to-Face interviews.
Eligibility :	Age 18+. The survey is a national representative sample of voting-age residents of Balochistan.
Total Respondents :	n = 5220
Response Rate :	Approximately 66% (Based on RR Formula developed by American Research Association)
Overall Margin of Error :	The Margin of Error is ±1.55% at the mid-range with a confidence level of 95%.

- **A Three-stage** sampling design was employed. In the first stage, a sample of districts was selected from Balochistan to ensure provincial representation. In the second stage, primary sampling units (PSUs)—such as tehsils or enumeration blocks—were selected within each sampled district, with separate strata for rural and urban areas. In the third stage, households were randomly selected from each PSU to serve as the final sampling units for data collection.
- The **Probability-Proportional-to-Size (PPS)** method was used to select Primary Sample Units (PSUs). Households within each PSU were selected through “Random walk method”. By which starting point was determined and by following the Right Hand Rule (RHR) pattern every nth household were selected for interviews.
- The **Kish Grid** was used to select respondents 18 years and older within these randomly selected household.
- The data was collected by using **CAPI** (Computer Assisted Personal Interview) technique.
- Interview teams were comprised of both males and females; the female respondents were interviewed by female interviewers and male respondents by male interviewers.
- The information in this report has been compiled in accordance with international standards for market and social research methodologies. Figures in charts and tables may not sum to 100 percent due to rounding error.






Urban /Rural




Gender




Income Level





Age Group

Mother Tongue*(Census 2023)







What do you think is the most important problem facing Balochistan?




Is electricity available in your area?

(Of those 62%, Who said "Yes")










How do you perceive the quality of education in government schools in your area?



In your opinion, what is the main problem facing the education sector?











Does your area have a functional government Basic Health Unit (BHU)?

Have you or any member of your household used the Sehat Card for medical treatment? If yes, how much benefit did you receive from it?




